CALLS FOR CHAPTERS AND ARTICLES

Handbook on "Minority place-name standardization. A comparison of regulations and approaches in Europe"

Common project of the Joint ICA/IGU Commission on Toponymy and the IGU Commission on Geography of Governance.

The book attempts to compare regulations in the countries of Europe with autochthonous linguistic minorities on the background of ethnic and linguistic

structures, historical and political developments, the political landscape, governance structures, and external relations. Is minority place-name standardization part of the general standardization process or are there specific regulations? Is it a bottom-up or a top-down process and which administrative levels are involved? The book is also going to explain, to what extent these regulations satisfy linguistic minorities and help to facilitate the relations between majority and minority.

The publication is planned by the end of 2023 in the book series <u>"Local and Urban Governance"</u>, (Springer) edited by Carlos Nunez Silva, Chair of the IGU Commission on Geography of Governance.

An intermediate project report will be presented at the IGU Centennial Congress in Paris, 18-22 July 2022, and a pre-conference workshop on the project will be organized in the framework of EuroCarto 2022 in Vienna (Austria), 18 September 2022

Our IGU First Vice-President, **Pr. lain Hay**, has been elected as one of the 2021 Fellows of the **AAG American Association of Geographers**.

The AAG Fellows is a program, started in 2018, to recognize geographers who have made significant contributions to advancing geography. This is a highly significant accolade and speaks to his outstanding contribution to our discipline. <u>Further information</u>

Chinese prize 2021 of

"National Advanced Collective for Poverty Alleviation"



The Chinese Academy of Sciences (CAS) undertook the scheme of third-party assessment of Targeted Poverty Alleviation (TPA) effectiveness and established for the first time, a national expert group on TPA third-party assessment.

Pr. Yansui Liu from the IGSNRR, CAS was commissioned to chair the national TPA third-party assessment project during 2015-2020. The group pioneered the evaluation index system, technical specification, and management system platform for China's

TPA third-party assessment. Between 2015 to 2020, more than 10,000 experts participated in the assessment survey of 603 counties, 5,380 villages, and more than 160,000 farming households in 22 central and western provinces, which is the biggest in scale and the broadest in scope in the world.

Their outstanding work won the prize of the

"National Advanced Collective for Poverty Alleviation" from the State Council in 2021.

COVID-19 Dynamic Monitoring System for National Prevention



After the outbreak of COVID-19, by fully playing the advantages of the geographic specialty and GIS technology, **Pr. Yansui Liu and his group from the IGSNRR, CAS** rapidly developed <u>"COVID-19 Dynamic Monitoring System for National Prevention"</u>,

It provided an important reference for the technical support and scientific decisionmaking of global and regional epidemic prevention.
